

Concerned Illinois Citizens Demand Investigation into Rep. Jan Schakowsky, Bob Creamer and the Instigation of Violence at Political Rallies.

Local residents plan protest march at Schakowsy's office Nov 1st to demand legal action for election crimes.

EVANSTON, Illinois-October 28, 2016

A group of concerned Chicagoland residents plan to issue a formal request on Tuesday, Nov. 1st that charges be filed against Bob Creamer and Scott Foval for the incitement of violence at the March Trump rally in Chicago, and an immediate investigation begin into the DNC and Jan Schakowsy's involvement in her husband's illegal activities.

Recent revealing videos from Project Veritas have shown both Creamer and Foval, as well as other operatives, discussing the instigation of violence at the Trump event at the UIC Pavillion, March 11, 2016. The event was cancelled due to the violent riot that ensued outside the Pavilion, which resulted in the injury of citizens and officers as well as significant property damage. Released videos also show a direct link between Creamer's organization, Democracy Partners, and the Hillary Clinton campaign.

Suzanne Monk, a Chicagoan who attended the rally stated, "That event was a horrific moment in many people's lives, and to find out it was a paid act of political terrorism is deeply concerning. We cannot survive in a country where these actions go unpunished"

The march plans to start at Jan Schakowsky's Evanston office at 820 Davis St. at 11am on Nov. 1st, and continue up Davis St to the Evanston Post Office. There, the group will mail formal requests to the FBI, FEC and Illinois State's Attorney demanding immediate legal action, before marching back to conclude in front of the representative's office.
